Later trips included visits to Central and South America, Israel, Greece, and Egypt; and then a 28-day trip to Japan, Hong Kong (where she had a silk dress made in a day while also visiting China!), Taiwan, Thailand, Singapore, the Philippines, and Guam.

Annie never married; her motto was love 'em and leave 'em, but she has a wonderful familial network of nephews and nieces, both in town and as far away as Seattle and Guam. She also has her friends that she has been writing to since 1950- three file boxes full of letters! In her words, "I have lived a good life."
